Abstract:

Our assumptions regarding teenagers' understanding of sexual assault and harassment are based on past research conducted through SSFC. The findings of that research point to the fact that teenagers think they know what sexual harassment and assault are, but when asked specific questions they really don't have a full understanding of it. This research project is being done to build on the initial research to discover what awareness levels young people have around these issues, and whether there needs to be curriculum changes in the high schools, as well as clearer school policies and guidelines for students and teachers. The information gathered will assist the KSAC in determining what type of programs we need to implement in high schools in this region.

Definitions and prelude to report

Background and Objectives

In order to gain a full understanding of this report we have included the definitions of sexual assault and sexual harassment as per the criminal code definitions.

Sexual Assault- is if anyone pressures or forces you into any sexual act. This includes unwanted kissing, fondling, sexual intercourse, rape and incest.

<u>Sexual Harassment</u>- is unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature. This includes leering, unwanted touching, verbal abuse or threats, unwelcome sexual flirtations.

In today's society, Sexual Harassment and Sexual Assault occur every single day and the issue itself is treated too lightly. Due to the embarrassment or the fright of talking to another individual or an assault centre, many of the incidents are forgotten and simply pushed aside. The issues that we will be referring to and speaking about in this project are very serious and could be taken offence to. Putting this aside, our group including Adam, Scott, Cam, Andrea and Cherie feel that this topic should not be ignored anymore.

Our objectives are to find out what knowledge the students at Sir Sandford Fleming College have regarding the issues. Do they know exactly what Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment is? Do they know that there are assault centre's you can go to, or call, such as the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre? After handing out our survey's and having collected the information, analyse the results we have determined what actions need to be taken. Our #1 objective is to complete this assignment in a manner that

government and public funding will be increased for the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre, and other organisations that deal with this issue.

Marketing Research Objectives

- #1. To determine Peterborough's community levels of awareness regarding the issues of Sexual Assault and Harassment.
- #2. To measure the attitudes and belief's of the community regarding Sexual Assault and Harassment.
- #3. To determine if there is a need for initiating an improved education program to raise community awareness, and aid in the prevention of Sexual Assault and Harassment.
- #4. To gather statistical information regarding Sexual Assault and Harassment.
- #5. To determine if there are difference of awareness levels between males and females.
- #6. To determine if there are difference in attitudes and beliefs between males and females.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Summary of findings

In the report you will find a number of facts and statistics relating to sexual assault and harassment within SSFC.

The students have given their time to conduct our survey regarding these issues.

The questions in the survey have been formed to stimulate responses that we felt would take honesty and courage to answer, in order to generate responses where we could measure the awareness levels of the students.

Some of the responses we have received seemed to be questionable. Examples are questions 9, 14, and 16. After comparing statistics from the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre, to our own the results it shows the results to be differentiated enough that they should be examined closely and analysed thoroughly.

Question # 9 posed the biggest problem for our research group to analyse. On average 85% of both males and females claimed to know the definition of sexual harassment. All participants in the survey said yes to at least one thing that constitutes sexual harassment. Refer to questions 2 through 8. However only 36% admitted to being sexually harassed.

From this we can conclude that a true understanding of sexual harassment is unknown by the participants or that it is to personal to some people to answer honestly.

Another question that needs to be examined is # 14. Has anyone ever exploited their position of authority, to get sex? Our results for this question are again differentiated from the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre's statistics. From this we have

concluded that fortunately for the students of S.S.F.C. they have not had to encounter what 50 to 60% of women in the Kawartha and four county areas have. Only 4% admitted that this has happened to them. Those results are encouraging, but a further analysis concludes that either the question could have been worded differently or that the question did not pertain to females within S.S.F.C. Hopefully when they do join the work force they will be able to elude this type of behavior.

Question # 16 Have you ever been given a date rape drug?

An astonishing 4% of females surveyed have been given the date rape drug. Obviously this question should have had more consideration when inserted into the questionnaire. Nobody knows that they have been given the date rape drug unless they have been examined by a doctor, or told by the assailant. According to the Centre's statistics roughly 11% of females and males have experienced the date rape drug or what they thought to be the date rape drug.

In conclusion some of the questions in the survey were either to explicit or personal for the surveyor to answer or the questions were too ambiguous. The results of the questions mentioned above are encouraging and positive, however they are not accurate, according to other statistics gathered. Either S.S.F.C. is one of a very few institutions where sexual harassment and assault are regarded as a severe invasion to any persons privacy, or people have learned to deal with their situations and emotions by bottling them inside themselves never to be taken off the shelf.

Part 3 Methodology How the research was conducted

Methodology

This research assignment was conducted on behalf of the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre. The survey was heavily scrutinised before a final copy was ready. Many draft forms of the survey had been made and altered before a final copy was made.

All of the surveys conducted on our behalf are going to be used as a test run for the Centre to conduct further research. Part of the marketing research team will also assist the Centre when they decide to further the research efforts.

The report that you are grading for the marketing research class was an internal run within the walls of S.S.F.C. About 50% of the surveys that have been filled out were from classrooms ranging from first year students to third year students. The other surveys were handed out to students at random. The L.R.C and the cafeteria were the main targets for the random surveys. A total of 200 surveys were printed for distribution to S.S.F.C students. We had a total of 120 completed properly and filled out accordingly. All of the surveys we handed out were completed, however, a large portion of them were ineffective. 34 of the surveys were returned with no specification of Male or Female gender. An additional 46 surveys were returned with no age specification. All of the surveys with either no age or gender elements were disregarded in the final analysis of the survey.

Another finding within the age groups that have been disregarded are 20 surveys filled out by the **other** category for age groups. This was done for two reasons:

- 1. The surveys gave no indication of the age of the people we were trying to obtain information from. The only information was that the students were over the age of 26.
- 2. All of the responses were equal to the other surveys conducted. No information could have been extracted directly from those surveys.

Overview of each question

FINDINGS

During this section, you will see that all of the answers to each individual question will be analyzed. Comments will be made on the findings that do not make sense, or seem to be alarming.

QUESTION #1

Do you know the definition of sexual harassment?

Females 18 to 25, 72% to 88% said yes.

Males 18 and 25, 84 % said yes.

Comments:

According to the responses for questions # 2 to # 9 it is clear they do not understand the definition.

Question # 2

Have you ever caught someone leering at you? Females 18 and 25, 72% of them said yes. Males 18 and 25, 72% to 76% said yes.

Question #3

Has anyone ever made sexual gestures to you? Females 18 and 25, 80% said yes. Males 18 and 25, 84% to 96% said yes.

Question #4

Has anyone displayed pornographic material that you did not want to see? Females 18 to 25, 40% said yes.

Males 18 to 25, 44% to 48% said yes.

Question #5

Has anyone ever made rude or derogatory remarks to you? Females 18 to 25, 74% to 76% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 68% to 80% said yes.

Ouestion #6

Has anyone made unwelcome inquiries about your sex life or sexual orientation? Females 18 to 25, 44% to 56%said yes.

Males 18 to 25, 48% to 60% said yes.

Comments:

This could be males making comment's to other males as a type of mockery. Yet, this still constitutes a form of sexual harassment.

Ouestion #7

Have you had unwelcome sexual flirtations, advances or propositions? Females 18 to 25, 68% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 56% said yes.

Question #8

Have you ever experienced verbal abuse, or threats? Females 18 to 25, 56% to 72% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 64% to 72% said yes.

Question #9

Have you ever been sexually harassed? Females 18 to 25, 36% to 44% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 28% to 36% said yes.

Comments:

As you can clearly see, 36% to 80% of females from ages 18 to 25 answered YES to the last 7 questions. Yet only 36% to 44% answered YES to question #9. This clearly proves a lack of understanding and the need for further education on this subject.

Question #10

Do you know the definition of Sexual Assault? Females 18 to 25, 84% to 88% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 80% to 84% said yes.

Question #11

Has anyone forced you to kiss him or her? Females 18 to 25, 16% to 20% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 20% said yes.

Question #12

Has anyone ever touched you where it was inappropriate, without consent? Females 18 to 25, 44% to 52% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 36% to 40% said yes.

Ouestion #13

Has anyone attempted to remove your clothing without permission or consent? Females 18 to 25, 12% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 16% to 20% said yes.

Question #14

Has anyone ever exploited his or her position of authority to get sex? Females 18 to 25, 4% to 12% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 8% to 12% said yes.

Question #15

Has anyone ever threatened to harm someone else if you did not agree to question #14? Females 18 to 25, 0% to 4% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 0% said yes.

Comments:

It was hard to grasp a real statistic on this as most people (if this has happened) because of fear, do not want to admit it.

Question #16

Have you ever been given the date rape drug? Females 18 to 25, 4% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 4% said yes.

Question #17

Have you seen any fliers that deal with healthy relationships? Females 18 to 25, 76% said yes.

Males 18 to 25, 64% to 68% said yes.

Question #17

Have you seen any fliers that deal with Sexual Assault? Females 18 to 25, 88% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 76% to 84% said yes.

Comments:

Many surveys were left blank regarding this question. Unfortunately there is not enough information out there because this is what this survey clearly told us.

Question #19

In your work or school is there a sexual harassment policy? Females 18-25, 60% to 64% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 56% to 72 % said yes.

Question #20

In your work or school, is it clear to whom you would report a complaint of Sexual Assault or Harassment?

Females 18 to 25, 24% to 28% don't know, 12% to 44% said no, 32% to 60% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 40% to 44% don't know, 0% to 32% said no, 28% to 56% said yes.

Question #21

If you were sexually assaulted would you call the Sexual Assault crisis line? Females 18 to 25, 52% to 64% said yes. Males 18 to 25, 52% to 56% said yes.

Once again, the surveyor's believed they knew (in average) what Sexual Assault was. Yet from the results, it is proven that there is a lack of knowledge and lack of understanding regarding Sexual Assault. This needs to be given more attention

Conclusion and Recommendations

In conclusion, the research survey that was conducted supports our concerns and beliefs towards the social issue of Sexual Assault and Harassment. Also, how relevant it is to our society.

Through the initial objectives of the survey we can assume conclusions for the overall report. The community, which will be represented by SSFC students' awareness levels of Sexual Assault and Harassment, are not at ideal levels for such an issue. They know and understand what the general meanings are, however seem to be unaware that these social issues can be addressed and spoken about without fear and embarrassment. It seems that no matter how young or old, male or female, Sexual Assault and Harassment is a sensitive subject. Fear or embarrassment may be a cause for hesitation to communicate openly regarding this subject.

The uneasy feelings behind this topic can be avoided by implementing an educational program concerning these topics. The results of the survey can justify launching such an educational program. Mostly everyone claims to have an awareness of Sexual Assault or Harassment within the S.S.F.C. However, the survey that we have conducted truly represents the need for more government and public funding to support better education programs instituted in all educational levels. Males and females demonstrate equal knowledge about sexual assault and harassment, however the knowledge seems to be limited.

We hope that market research such as this report can help the Kawartha Sexual Assault Centre and other centres alike. Hopefully efforts of market research will be

conducted for these centres form Sexual Assault and Harassment. Also, a means to prevention.
