Background



This makes it especially important to focus on implanting programs in order to better assist new and existing immigrant entrepreneurs and allow them to integrate into the community to their fullest potential

Research Questions

- What services or organizations work better than others in facilitating these immigrant entrepreneurs?
- In general, how successful have immigrant entrepreneurs been in Peterborough up to this point?
- What support systems for immigrant entrepreneurs current exist in Peterborough? How successful are these programs?
- What type of support(s) must be provided for the immigrant entrepreneur community in Peterborough to be successful?

Findings

 - Development of Canadian business experience and local market knowledge
 - Develop entrepreneurial skills
 - Networking development
 - iii. Workshops
 - Language, with focus on business
