

Background

The Victim Services unit at the Peterborough Police Station strives to provide post-incident and long-term information, as well as referral needs to victims of crime. Victim Services seek to maintain high quality services to crime victims by maintaining officer awareness of victims' concerns while also maintaining liaison with other network and resources in the community.

Methodology
